As the year progressed Homecoming loomed in everyone's mind. We hardworking sophomores decided to enter a float and, after long hard hours of work won first place.



The moon was still shining brightly when thoughts of curfew began to break the romantic spell. As couples left, the took home with them memories.







Through the year, the seniors have contributed much to the "Spirit of CHS, as reflected here.






