


All decked out in wild-colored shirts and patterned pants, 322 students entered the building August 25, 1986 to show everyone that their time had come.





The 1986 Viking football squad wasted no time proving that they were a team to contend with. The first game of the year was a complete domination over Orion (18-0) and there was no stopping them from there. After a close victory over Princeville, the Vikings swept the first five conference games, but their winning streak ended at seven games when the Vikes met ROVA, who was also undefeated. After a heartbreaking loss, they finished the conference season in second place by beating Winola. They qualified for the 1A state playoffs for the second consecutive year. Powerful Annawan ended the Vikes' hopes of moving on by defeating them 20-0, on the home field. The Vikings season ended with an 8-2 record, which can be described as nothing less than outstanding.

The over-all strength of the squad was recognized by their conference opponents when six players were elected to the all-conference first team offense and three players were elected to the all-conference first team defense. Offensive honors went to Brent Reed, Brian Matson, Chris McClain, Jeff Noble, Neil Jordan, and Jim Flaherty. Defense honors went to Chris McClain, Jeff Noble, and Jim Flaherty. Special Mention was given to Craig Anderson and Tom Hasson for the offensive team, and Brian Matson, Chip Bayless, Kurt Melton, and Craig Anderson for the defensive team.







XHAUSTING PRACTICES BUILD ENDURANCE











Coach Taylor shared his spectacular basketball ability with his new team and built their confidence so they always had the winning attitude, which makes a good team in more ways than one.

XCEPTIONALLY AWESOME-VIKES MAKE SWEET SIXTEEN

As November approached, the people of Cambridge knew that an exciting season, provided by the boys' varsity basektball team, was in store for them. They were not mistaken; the Vikings started the season by winning the Annawan Thanksgiving Tournament, as well as all of their nonconference games. They placed second in the Orion Tournmanet, after Sherrard squeezed by the Vikes with a 65-63 win. They then proceeded to take the conference crown without a loss, something that has never been accomplished by any varisty boy's team before. As playoff time approached, the gentlemen, with their 23-1 record, were looking to go far. The Vikes won the Orion Regional, after thriling victories over Rockridge (62-51) and Orion (56-49). They continued on their path of wins, edging by Roseville (53-52) and Knoxville (63-60) to earn the Sectional crown as well as a seat in the Sweet-Sixteen, which is also a first in varsity boys' history. The Vikes fantastic season ended with a loss to undefeated Pearl City in the East Moline Super-Sectional. In that game, the Vikes came from a thirteen point defecit to a near win and lost by only three points (56-53).

The Vikes have much more to boast about than just an extraordinary season; seniors Craig Anderson, Chris McClain, and Brian Matson were recognized as being all-state honorable mention as well as making the all-conference first team.

Much of the success of the team can be attributed to the unity and intelligence of the team and their fourth-year supercoach, J. C. Wise.














XTENDING THE WINNING SPIRIT






